## WHERE ARE THE LEADERS?

#### A CRISIS OF REALITY

In the last few years, we as church leaders have been awakened in the body of Christ to a whole new crisis of reality. Many churches are facing a critical lack of leaders, a rapidly changing culture, and a nationwide decline in church attendance.

If you're being honest, you've noticed it: In general, we haven't been as intentional or strategic as we've needed to be, and we've not prioritized the significance of raising leaders. Others have become innocent bystanders as cultural conflicts, technological disruptions and supply chain changes have vastly altered the systems, processes, expectations and tools of Kingdom ministry.

It's like we've awakened to realize we're taxi drivers in the age of Uber.

Yes, people still need transportation, but how they engage

and access transportation has changed significantly! Now, the question isn't whether something <u>needs</u> to change; we know it does. The question is <u>what</u> needs to change? And <u>where</u> do we begin the transformation?

### MOVING PEOPLE ON TO MISSION

Without a doubt, there are growing churches. But it's no secret that statistics from Barna and Pew Research Center report that, in many places, the American church today is in decline and losing its impact in the culture.

I observe that there are fewer and fewer reasons today for people even to show up at church. People are tired, they work hard, and on Sundays, they don't want to "just go to church."

But this news isn't all bad. I see church being simplified down to two primary tracks:

- Seekers Those looking for purpose or having a curiosity about Jesus, interested in knowing more or becoming a believer in some manner, and...
- Believers on mission Those truly looking to discover how they can live out their Kingdom purpose and fulfill their destiny on the earth.

Simple attenders, those looking for "a good Word this week," who attend largely out of tradition, are waning. Because they attend to consume, most of today's church environments aren't engaging enough to be worthy of their effort to attend church. Without a heart change, they'll likely leave.

The churches that seem to be growing and thriving today are

those that have become laser-focused and intentional about moving people onto mission.

Some churches today have simply become gathering centers. Their aim is largely about how to get people involved and serving in their church. Their pastors genuinely love people and have good hearts, but their focus is less about equipping their members for their God-given purpose and more about getting them involved in church programs.

In this way, the church has become the mission instead of the world becoming the mission!

Other pastors see the church as a training center, and Sunday morning is the locker room. They know their members are created to be powerful for the Kingdom, and that their purpose is lived out as much or more Monday-Saturday as it is on Sunday. They want to prepare, heal and empower people to get where they need to be.

These pastors recognize that, while gathering time is essential, and while investing in the local body is necessary, we must be Kingdom-minded and not merely church-minded.

## FOLLOWERS DON'T IMPACT AND CHANGE THE CULTURE; LEADERS DO!

All leaders have a vision and are driving toward its fulfillment. So from my perspective, we need a greater focus on the discovery and development of true leaders.

Note the following tweet by church consultant and leadership coach Aubrey Malphurs:

He also said, "Too many pastors 'do the ministry' rather than 'equip others for ministry.' One leads to a plateau, one to growth."

Quite frankly, it amazes me how many churches have  $\underline{no}$  strategy or plan in place to empower and develop these leaders. I guess they just expect to pray for God to drop them out of the sky? Many churches would agree with the need to grow leaders, but in reality they just don't do it.

I say this with deep conviction: If we fail to develop leaders, our churches will fail to reach their God-given purpose and potential.

That is what we do at CLST Global.

## THE MISSING LINK

### A CALL FOR SOUND BIBLICAL AND THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION

I am not suggesting that a sound Biblical and theological education is a substitute for:

- Spiritual mentoring
- Practical ministry skills development
- Hands-on experience

However, it's also very clear that Biblical education has become a missing link for many of our churches in today's landscape of Christian leadership and ministry.

I'm concerned that we inadvertently undermine the tremendous value of theological education when we throw around phrases like, "Things I didn't learn in Bible college..." or read articles titled "10 Things Seminary Can't Teach."

Obviously Bible school can't teach you everything you need to know. But would you trust a neurosurgeon who'd *only* had

on-the-job training and never gone to school? Of course not! Would you give your 16-year-old a car without <u>any</u> classroom driver's education time? Hopefully not. Yes, there are things you can't learn apart from the process of hands-on surgery or behind-the-wheel driving, but you can't say it's not necessary to learn in the classroom.

Because on-the-job training isn't a substitute for education, that's exactly what makes church-based campuses so powerful. Church-based campuses have that special environment of accountability, the wise experience of mentors, community relationships and the week-to-week ministerial issues that don't happen in a Bible college where students are just taking classes.

### MYTH BUSTERS

In many instances, leadership development has come to mean the latest secular theories of modern thought. However, while Jim Collins and John Maxwell have fantastic insights regarding leadership culture as a whole, they don't necessarily convey the significance of a solid theological foundation for your leaders.

"Theology" is a powerful word! Though it may sound stuffy or high-and-mighty to some, theos (God) + logia (study and knowledge of) = the ability to know who God really is. Therefore, I have the capacity to frame my life and future on a solid Biblical foundation. For far too long, many people's perspective has been that Bible college is just for church workers, but that's a myth we're busting. In reality, theological education is for everyone who wants to stand toe-to-toe and eye-to-eye with secular culture and be powerfully on-mission for the Kingdom.

Here's an illustration: I had the privilege of pastoring Evangel Cathedral, one of America's great charismatic churches located in South Carolina. During my tenure, the resignation of our highly trusted business administrator sent us scurrying for a successor to serve in this vital role. I found a highly qualified young man with a Masters Degree in business from a major university. Additionally, he was raised in the church by wonderful Spirit-led parents and had even participated in one of the nation's best internship programs for youth ministry.

Though he possessed some good leadership skills, he quickly pointed out to me that he'd never truly had the opportunity to attend Bible college. He felt he was missing the training, equipping and theological education that would help him to maximize his potential on the job and in his life. Because we had a church-based Bible school, this young man was able to earn his Bachelor of Theology degree and become the major contributor in our organization that he knew he could be. (I'm proud to say he and his wife now pastor an extremely healthy and growing church body in Alabama!)

### GIFTED BUT NOT MATURE

I've had the philosophy that my full-time staff members were, at minimum, going to have a B.Th. In doing so, they would be able to demonstrate a high level of commitment to biblical literacy; to studying and learning; to qualify themselves (show themselves approved); and move beyond the moniker of simply being "great people."

A lot of churches these days are hiring talented people, but without a Biblical education. It's easy to assume that gifted people are Biblically mature when they're not. Oftentimes, many of their decisions and worldview have been shaped by secularism, not rooted in Kingdom thought and Biblical truth. Not only is this problematic, it has the potential to end in disaster when the Enemy comes to entice and deceive.

My point is this: As seasoned, trusted church leaders, we are in the best position to provide the essential theological education and training for leaders under our care and oversight. It should be our mission to ensure a sound investment into their development — so that no link is missing.

Many Christians cannot identify more than two or three of the disciples. According to data from the Barna Research Group, 60 percent of Americans can't name even five of the Ten Commandments."

There is a huge assumption that we make as church leaders: Our people — and even staff — are rooted in the faith and grounded in sound fundamental doctrine. The truth is, many are not! As a result, they are subject to theological error and heresy more than we often realize.

In today's cultural climate, it's more important now than

ever that we exemplify Paul's example at the Areopagus (aka Mars' Hill), found in Acts 17. Paul communicates with such a profound relevance to a Biblically illiterate culture that — while some mocked — others joined him <u>or at least</u> wanted to hear more.

This Christian education gap can only be bridged with intentional, systematic Bible training.

For those in your church who don't feel called to the vocational ministry, your Bible school will help establish them to apply Biblical truths in their professions and circles of influence.

It will strengthen their faith foundations and prepare them for a lifetime of effective Kingdom service.

They'll be both successful and powerful for God!
